Who We Are

After 200 days without a permanent minister, we welcome Rev. William Collins III as our Pastor at Park View Christian Church. That means that this will be the last issue where I write the front-page article for this newsletter and I gladly turn my pen over to Pastor Will for the April edition.

As I look back on the 200 days that we spend without a permanent minister, I feel it is appropriate to reflect on the first front-page article that I wrote for the September 2018 edition. In that article, I asked the question "who are we?" I asked if we were only defined by who our Pastor is, or if we were truly a priesthood of all believers as described in I Peter 2:5-9.

"⁵like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For it stands in scripture: 'See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame.' ⁷To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner.' ⁸and 'A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall.' They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. ⁹But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."

I closed that article with a challenge to fully embrace being a priesthood of all believers and continue to flourish in our time of transition, and I think we can safely say that we have. Looking back at the past 200 days, not only did we still participate in all of the normal things (such as the coat drive, Operation Santa Clause, and blanket Sunday), but we even grew a bit with the beautiful Christmas Eve play "Into the Light" which was directed by Stephanie Bulldis, and the unveiling of our combined worship service which fuses

traditional and contemporary elements which allows us all to worship together as a single Park View Christian Family.

Seeing how well we have done as a church without a permanent minister makes me incredibly excited to see how far we can go with Pastor Will as our spiritual leader. With him leading our team the best days for Park View Christian Church are truly ahead of us. We are that movement for wholeness in a fragmented world who welcomes all to the Lord's Table as God has welcomed us. And we are dedicated to our mission of helping people engage in a growing relationship with lesus Christ and create a nurturing, loving congregation that will continually reach out to those who don't yet know him, through various ministries.

We have our identity. We have our mission. And now we have our minister with Pastor Will. Now let's get to work Park View! Amen.

Welcome to Pastor William Collins III

As most of you know by now, we have a new Permanent Minister for Park View Christian Church. On Sunday, February 24, 2019 at our Called Congregational meeting, Pastor Will received a unanimous vote to issue him the Call to serve our church. He is very excited about all possibilities that God has planned. He will begin on staff on March I and will establish office hours soon. I have included a little synopsis of his resume for you all.

Will Collins was born in Norfolk, Virginia and grew up in a loving family, the youngest of 4 children. He spent his early years in Georgia where his father served in ministry. Following High School, Will entered University of Maryland to study Pre-Law. While there he experienced the sudden accidental death of his best friend. This led to accepting a 6 month Study Abroad program in South Africa, and focused time and energy on reconciliation in post-apartheid South Africa. His journey took him to other countries too. He then moved to Brooklyn, New York and served as

evangelist, counselor and teacher for Metro Ministries, one of the largest youth ministries in the world. He worked with many underprivileged youth from the Boroughs. He produced videos documenting the plight of poor youth around the world, including abandoned newborns in Haiti, crack-addicted babies in the Bronx and homeless kids living in trash dumps.

His calling then led him to return to Norfolk, Virginia where he has dedicated himself to serving our community. He was on the Board of Directors for Friends of Norfolk Juvenile Court, a Mentor for Norfolk Public Schools, Member of Community Housing Development Organization, and Tidewater Emmaus. Currently, Will works fulltime from his home for Center for Medicare Services.

He was certified as a Church Planter with the V3 Church Plant Movement, and is also a certified life coach. He was raised in the Baptist Church and received his license to preach in 2013 at New Calvary Baptist. Then moved to Foundry United Methodist Church and served as Worship Leader, Bible Study Teacher and Leadership Training, as well as preaching. William is a servant leader with a vision and passion for ministry. He is dedicated to progressively leading the Body of Christ in the twenty-first century.

Will Collins states his most important accomplishment is the "love of my life, my wife Kelly, and our three daughter: Micah (13), Eliana (5) and Ava (3)."

I cannot thank the Search and Call team enough for their dedicated work and research, calls, interviews and discussions that led to this time. Now we must all pull together and support our new minister in every way we possibly can and strive to grow the church.
