### **Proverbs 6:16-19**


There are six things the Lord hates, seven that are detestable to him:  
**17** haughty eyes, a lying tongue, hands that shed innocent blood,  
**18** a heart that devises wicked schemes, feet that are quick to rush into evil.  
**19** a false witness who pours out lies and a person who stirs up conflict in the community .

Gustavo Gutierrez, a Catholic priest speaks about the return of Christ, "The sign of the coming of the Messiah is the suppression of oppression: The Messiah arrives when injustice is overcome. When we struggle for a just world in which there is not servitude, oppression or slavery, we are signifying the coming of the Messiah. Therefore the messianic promises bind tightly together the kingdom of God and better living conditions for human beings. .. The kingdom comes to suppress injustice." Regardless if you agree with his prediction , the world is constantly experiencing social upheaval.

People are striving for justice, for freedom, for opportunity, for equality. You may feel like a spectator helplessly watching these dramas play out on the nightly news. You have power! 
Pray and meditate on simple ways you can impact your community to help suppress oppression and end strife.



## The Story of a Food Pantry Ministry

An idea sprang to life last week and it was actually implemented on Tuesday, April 28, 2020. The idea was about how do we continue in some type of Food Outreach ministry to the community during a time of Public Health crisis due to COVID 19, a Stay At Home Order, as well as an economic crisis in which many had lost jobs and were suffering and hungry.

For many years, Park View has had a small Food Pantry which was filled by donations from congregants as well as CWF funding. We had served around 15 families per month for

years. Well, on Monday, April 27-2020- 4 members gathered (social distancing maintained) and 26 boxes and bags of groceries were packed for distribution.

Then on Tuesday, April 28- The parking lot was set up with a table and some chairs and signs were out that from 11 am-1 pm Park View will host its first DRIVE THRU FOOD PANTRY! We had 16 families come through and they ALL were extremely grateful.

Fast forward to Now- 2 years later, we offer a Drive Thru Food Pantry every week and are averaging 85-90 families per week!!

Our team of volunteers has

grown , and so has our many donations from community stores and individuals !

Who would have thought this would still be in place and reach so many people in this way. We also offer prayers and invite all to worship.

Yes it was and is a labor of Love but well worth it. If you would like to help out, please call Chip Artz.


