Message from Pastor Will

On a chilly Fall night, I was on my way to a good friend's house to watch a football game. While turning on a red light I was side swiped by an oncoming car. After calling the police I got out of my car, preparing to question the skill and mental capacity of the driver. Needless to say I was angry. As I walked up to the older gentleman I could see the fear and concern of the situation was overwhelming him. My anger turned into compassion and I began consoling him and explaining the proper procedures after an accident. He didn't speak fluent English so I had to tell him a few times. Afterwards, he asked me if I was a Christian and invited me to his church.

In the midst of the confusion, fear, and anger, God showed up and allowed two strangers who should be at odds to minister to each other. In that moment compassion overcame the negative consequences of our shared circumstance. Alone we could have sat brooding but by sharing the situation, a relationship was fostered and a friendship formed. When we lead with compassion the consequences become opportunities for relationship and understanding.

Today choose compassion to lead your actions!

Fatigue makes cowards of us all. When we feel defeated it may be because we are exhausted. Rest doesn't always mean sleep, it can mean stepping away from a situation and giving it a rest. I took cable television out of our house years ago because the vitriol coming into my house was wearing me down. I needed rest. I had negativity fatigue. Christ often left the people to go be alone and rest. Make time to rest, make space for peace, tune out the noise of negativity and hear the Holy Spirit's gentle voice of joy and positivity. It's time to take in some good vibrations!!

Where can I register to vote?

Early In Person Voting

You can vote early at your local registrar's office beginning 45 days before Election Day and ending the Saturday before Election Day. Before visiting your local registrar's office, **check your registration status** or call your registrar's office.

To vote early in-person, do the following:

- Starting 45 days before Election Day, visit your local registrar's office or a satellite voting location in your county or city to vote early. Remember, the Saturday before Election Day is the last day to vote early.
- You do not have to have a reason or fill out an application to vote early. At the registrar's office or satellite voting location, you must provide your name and address and show an acceptable form of ID or sign an ID Confirmation Statement. If acceptable identification is not provided, you must sign an ID Confirmation Statement or a provisional ballot will



be offered and you are allowed until the Friday at noon following the election to provide a copy of acceptable identification to the electoral board or sign an ID Confirmation Statement. Provisional voters receive a notice to remind them of the deadline and right to attend the electoral board meeting. Accessible equipment and/or curbside voting is available upon request.

To all Virginians voting by mail/ absentee ballots for the November 3, 2020 elections:

If you believe you may not safely have a witness present while completing the absentee ballot for the November 3, 2020 Election, you are not required to have a witness present or have a witness sign your ballot envelope.

Your ballot will not be rejected due to a missing witness signature. These instructions override any instructions on your ballot envelopes regarding witness signatures.

What does Disciples of Christ say about Voting? A Word from the NATIONAL BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION

Our country has an opportunity to express our Christian values during these troubling times each time we go to vote. Elections bring forth many issues that we hold dear to us. The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has been called to work for the common good, to build a more just society, and to help the needy and less fortunate among us. We are fortunate to live in a free democratic society, where we have freedom of religion. There is no religious test for voting and we are able to express our views on social issues freely. As Christians, we believe we have a two-fold obligation. We are obligated to vote and raise our voices in support of issues that informed by our faith. We also have the obligation to make sure that all members of our society have voting rights and the ability to freely express their concerns as well. A society is strong when it facilitates the equal participation of all its citizens. Vot-

ing rights is a justice issue. In American history, the churches and concerned Christians have played a monumental role in extending the voting franchise, opposing slavery, supporting the civil rights movement and the struggle for women's suffrage. All citizens should be free to vote. Our democracy is only as good as the laws we enact to treat all persons equally and give all citizens the full opportunity to participate. In order to vote in the United States, you must be registered. Church groups can help more people to vote by sponsoring community-based voter registration efforts among the parts of the population that have low levels of voter registration and participation. These include young people, newly naturalized citizens, elderly citizens, and low income and underrepresented groups. We need to remind our church members

of their obligation to register and vote. We can start by getting people registered in the congregation. We can offer them the opportunity to support programs in our community that are organized to assist everyone in our society to register to vote. People who take the time to vote often get more engaged with their surrounding community. This is not an easy task to get people registered to vote. However, if we succeed, we can have an amazing opportunity to use our voice during these tumultuous times.

***At Park View we are excited to announce our very first voter registration drive that happened on September 23 & 30. Not only were we able to register people to vote, we were able to provide much needed information regarding the right to vote, how to vote, and where to vote!**

The Rocks Are Crying Out: Show Up, Speak Up, Stand Up

*Some Pharisees from the crowd told him, “Teacher, get your disciples under control!”
But he said, “If they kept quiet, the stones would do it for them, shouting praise.” Luke 19:39-40*

It has been 20 years since we proclaimed our anti-racist and pro-reconciliation identity. We keep trying it on to see if it fits. Over and over again, we find that it does. On September 27th and October 4th, we will receive the special offering for Reconciliation Ministry in congregations.

This year's theme is fitting for our response to the sustained unrest that has propelled the many to engage in social activism in small towns and major cities. **The Rocks Are Crying Out: Show Up, Speak Up, Stand Up**, based in Luke 19:36 -40, reminds us, that like those first century disciples following Jesus into Jerusalem, we must lift our voices to acknowledge the divine message and the divine messenger that is Christ with us. We are the ones to break the silence of oppression and suppression of human dignity based on the color of a person's skin or their nation of origin.

The harmful impact of systemic racism has been laid bare in the health disparities of those impacted by the novel coronavirus, compelling us to '**speak up**' naming the conditions that unjustly impact poor, black, and brown communities.

The extra-judicial treatment of black and brown bodies has compelled many to '**show up**' in peaceful protests to affirm equitable treatment by law enforcement and to affirm human dignity for ALL.

We, too, are compelled to '**stand up**' to witness to Christ's profound love on behalf of those who are without hope because of historic economic oppression and wealth disparities in our communities.

Your generosity to Reconciliation Ministry strengthens the work and witness of congregations to be the vicarious presence of Christ where we serve.

Your giving promotes programs that provide anti-racism and pro-reconciliation education and resources such as our "Choose Your Own Adventure" online bible study created by Disciples Peace Interns.


RECONCILIATION SPECIAL OFFERING 2020

Reconciliation Ministries

In 1967, the Church was gathering in its 118th Assembly and final Assembly as the International Convention of Christian Churches, soon to be named Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). During this gathering, a group of courageous men and women met and started working on a resolution to bring to before the assembly to challenge the church to be the Church and work on the issues of poverty and racism. In March of the following year, in 1968, just one month before the assassination of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., the first steering committee met to implement the Resolution 29, our Church's intentional effort to address the sin of racism through funding and

direct action in the communities where our congregations, Regions, General Ministries and Recognized Ministry partners serve. 2018 marks the 50th Anniversary of both, the work of Reconciliation in our Church and the assassination of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Therefore, we invite you to join us as we celebrate the intersection of both transforming events. We will be reflecting on our mission through historical facts and the message of Dr. King "Remaining Awake through a Great Revolution."



"Whoever oppresses a poor man insults his Maker, but he who is generous to the needy honors him."
Proverbs 14:31

"A righteous man knows the rights of the poor; a wicked man does not understand such knowledge."
Proverbs 29:7

Websters Dictionary defines the word poor as, "lacking material possessions; of, relating to, or characterized by poverty." In 1968, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. organized a march on Washington to promote a vision that united the poor and provide a positive and meaningful impact on the community. Through that vision, the Poor People's Campaign came to fruition. The Poor Peoples Campaign encompasses an overarching desire to demand justice for all, to fight the war on hunger and to promote a moral revival in our great nation. In 2017, the General Assembly of the Disciples of Christ heard the cry of the needy, the poor, and the opposed, and adopted a resolution to support the Poor Peoples Campaign. As a church, the Disciples of Christ answered their call.

As we continue to combat the effects of the pandemic, we are faced with the underlying residual problem that continues to exist in our nation, hunger and poverty. As reported by NPR, "Even before the pandemic hit, some 13.7 million households, or 10.5% of all U.S. households, experienced food insecurity at some point during 2019, according to data from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. (www.npr.org).

That works out to more than 35 million Americans who were either unable to acquire enough food to meet their needs, or uncertain of where their next meal might come from, last year." The pandemic is continuing to intensify this horrific static, food insecurity in our nation is worsening.

Over the past several weeks, Pastor Will has preached about and asked us, **"what is your assignment?" "What is God asking US to do?" Can you hear the cry of the needy? Do you hear the rumble of hunger? Are we righteous enough to know the rights of the poor?**
