
many ways. There is a place for everyone who is willing to volunteer to help.



Leo George Ruffing, 91, passed away peacefully on May 8, 2023. He was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to the late Catherine and Lawrence Ruffing. Leo was a Veteran of Korea. He started his service career in the Army in 1948 and then enlisted in the Air Force and retired in 1970. Leo graduated from Park College with a bachelor's degree, Eastern Kentucky University with a master's degree, and Bethany Bible College with a Doctor of Ministry. Leo celebrated 65 years of sobriety and was a mentor to countless others on their path to recovery. After retiring from the military, he worked in the field of substance abuse for the Volunteers of America and later the US Navy. He spent many hours volunteering at the Oasis Social Ministry in Portsmouth and rebuilding homes in Gulfport, Mississippi after hurricane Katrina. Leo was an avid fan of the Pittsburgh Steelers and University of Kentucky basketball. He loved reading and history and was an active member of Park View Christian Church.

Leo was the husband of the late Theresa A. Ruffing. He is survived by his five children, James Ruffing, David Ruffing and wife Kathleen, George-Ann Wood, Wayne "Scott" Ruffing and wife Cherry and Michael Ruffing and wife Erin; seven grandchildren, Whitney, Doug, Noah, Joseph, Caymon, Ellie and Nolan; four great-grandchildren and four brothers, Jack, Jim, Gilbert and Donald. In addition to his wife, Leo is also predeceased by four siblings, Larry, Betty, Lois and Alice.

A celebration of life service will be held at 10 a.m. Thursday, May 18, 2023, at Park View Christian Church, 3201 Western Branch Blvd., Chesapeake, Virginia 23321. Pastor Will Collins and Dr. Brian Ray will be officiating the service. The burial will be private at the Albert G. Horton, Jr. Memorial Veterans Cemetery in Suffolk, Virginia.


